Early Years Foundation Stage Profile - Attainment Gap Trends 2019 to 2023



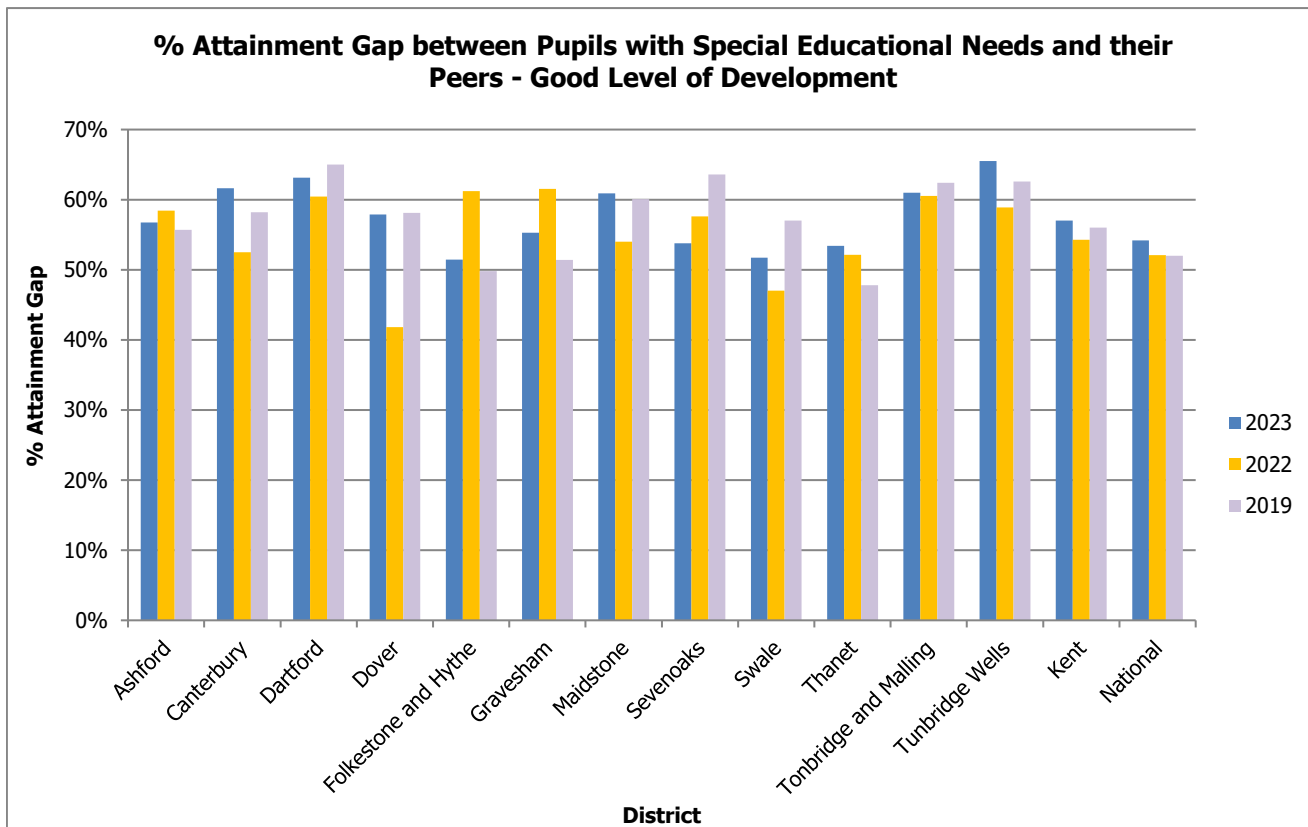

Key Stage One Attainment by District - 2023



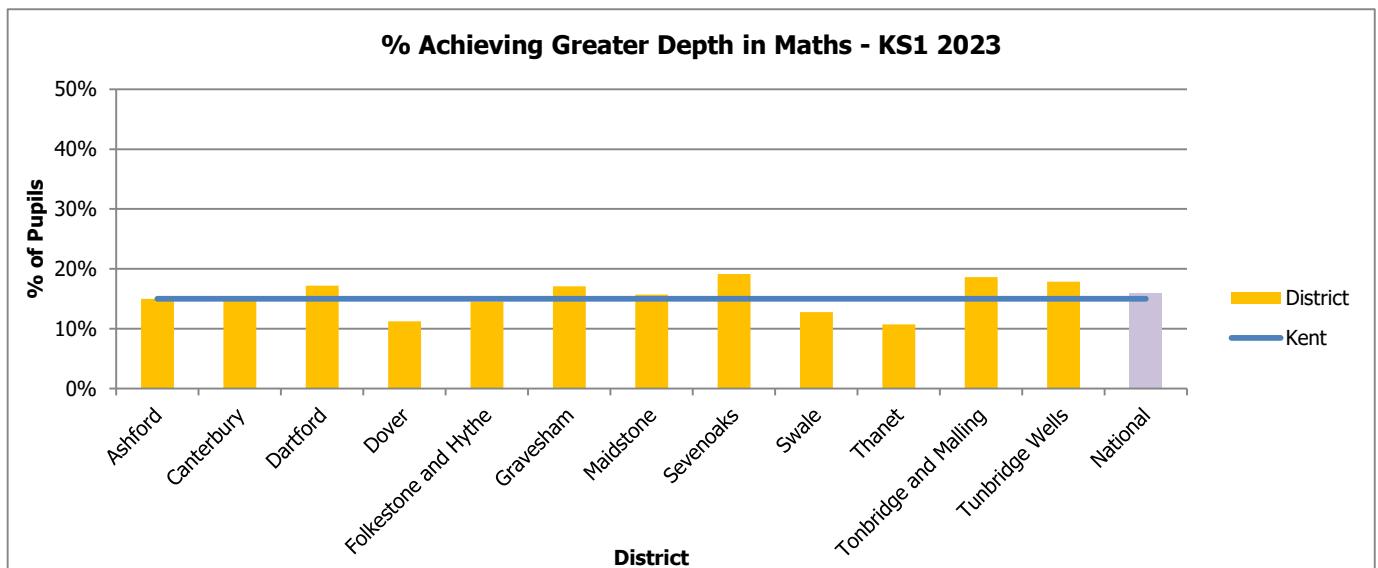
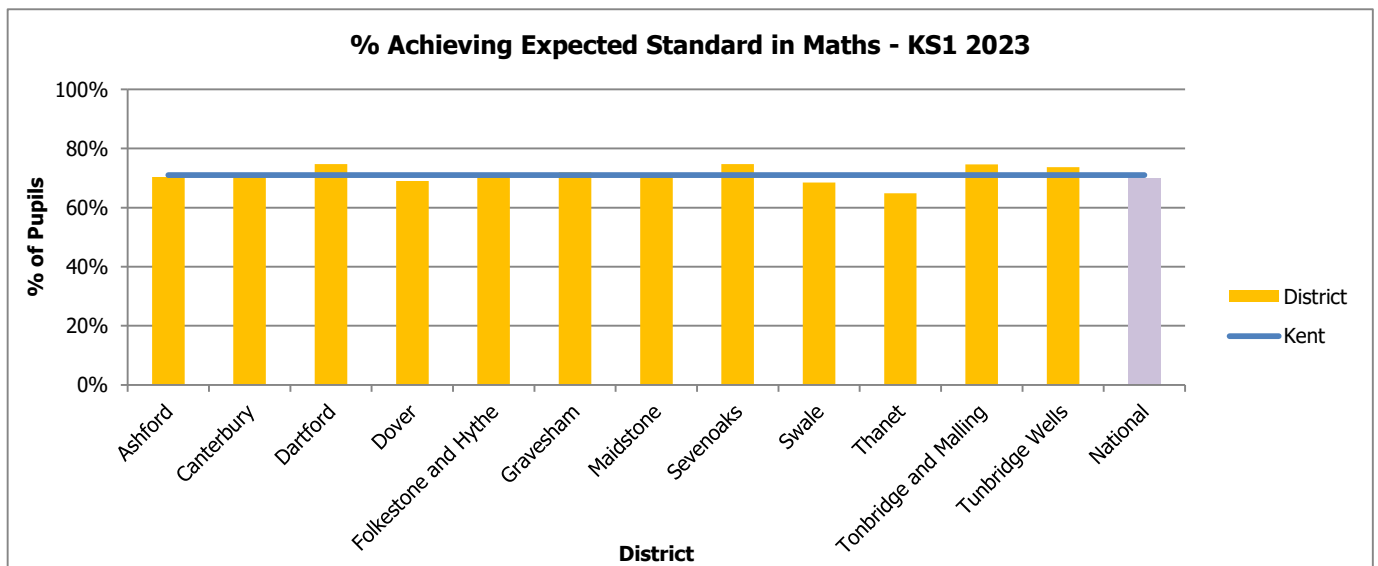
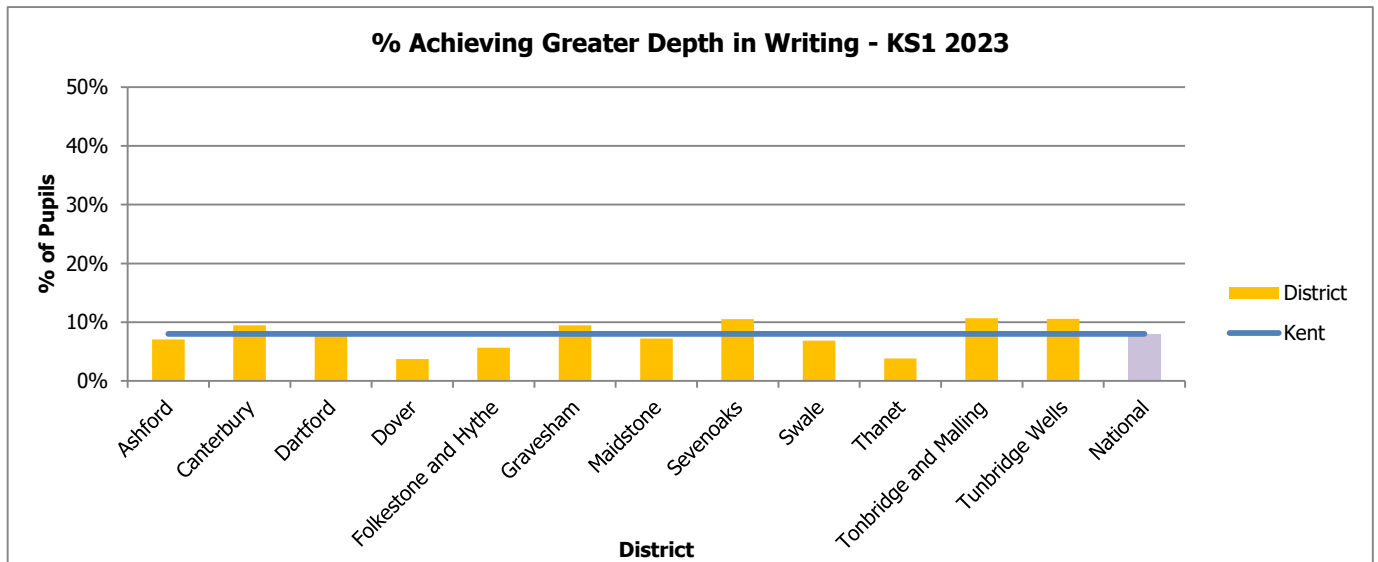

Key Stage Two Trend by District - 2019 to 2023



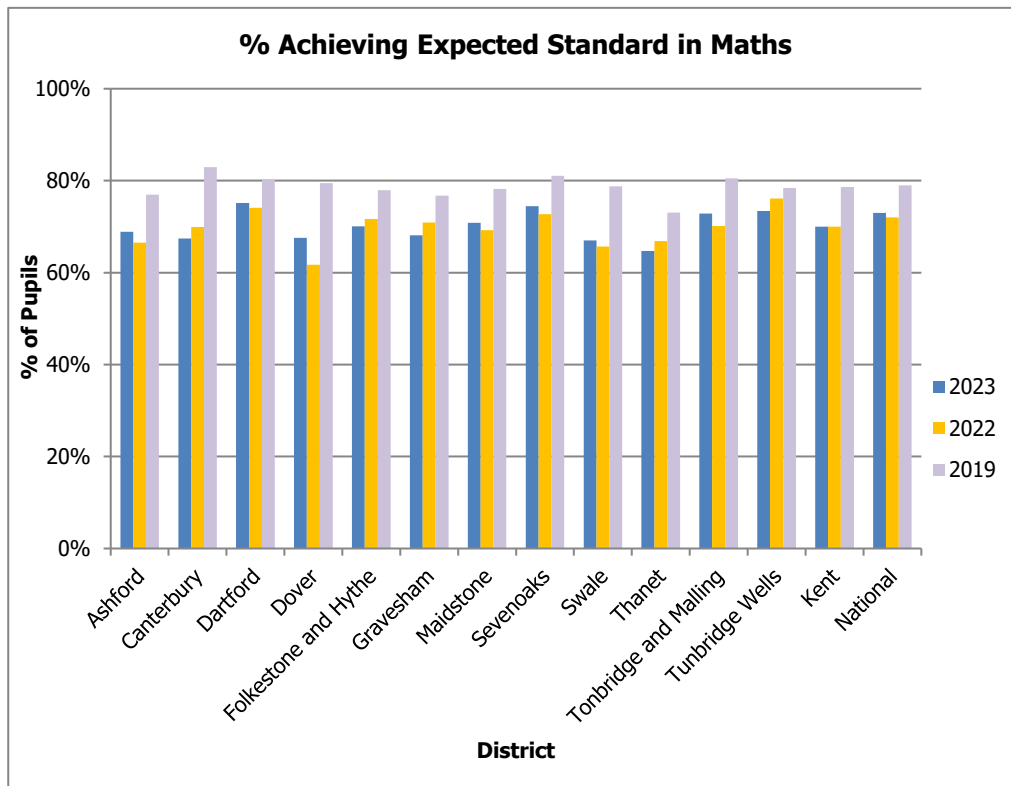
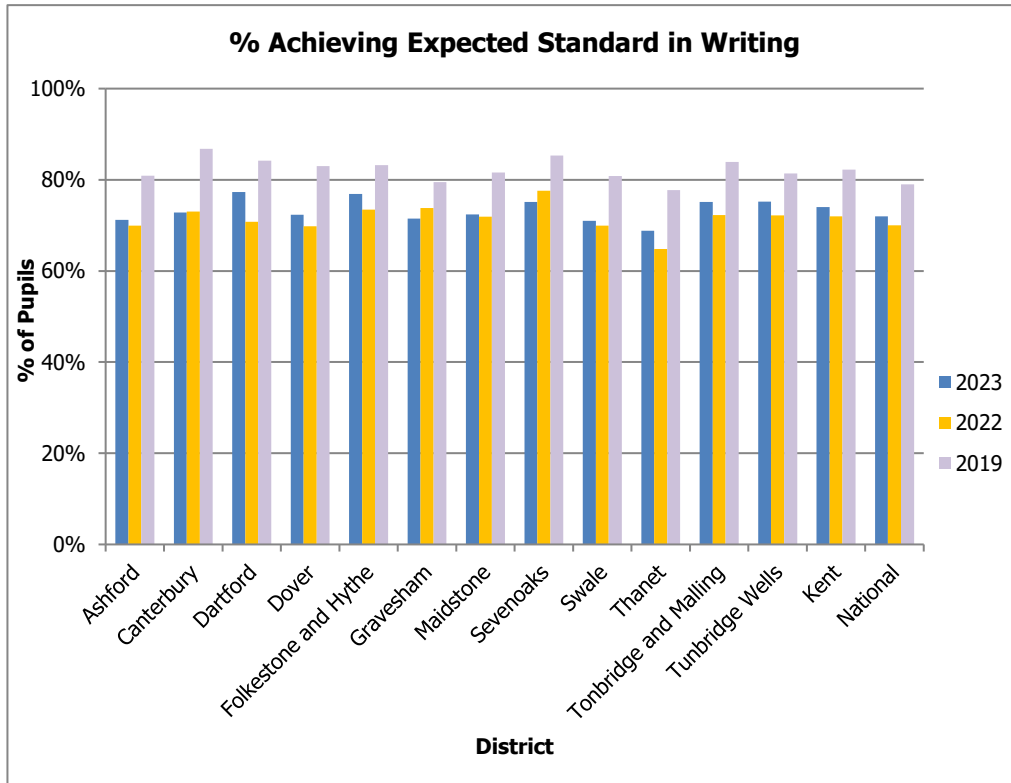

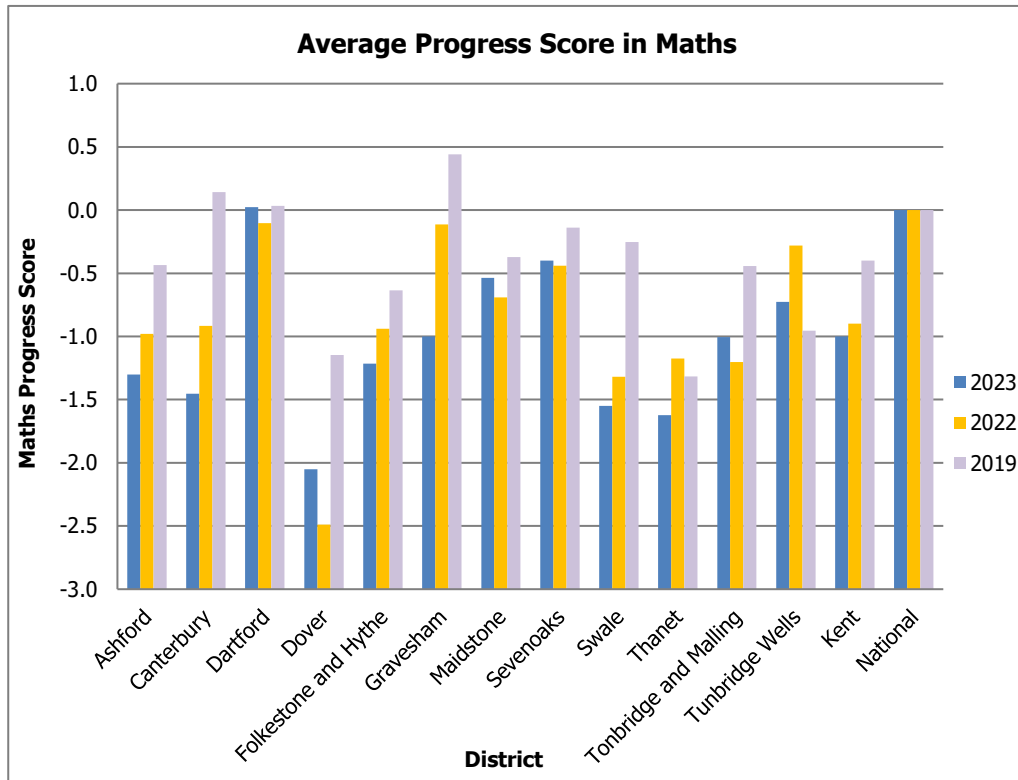

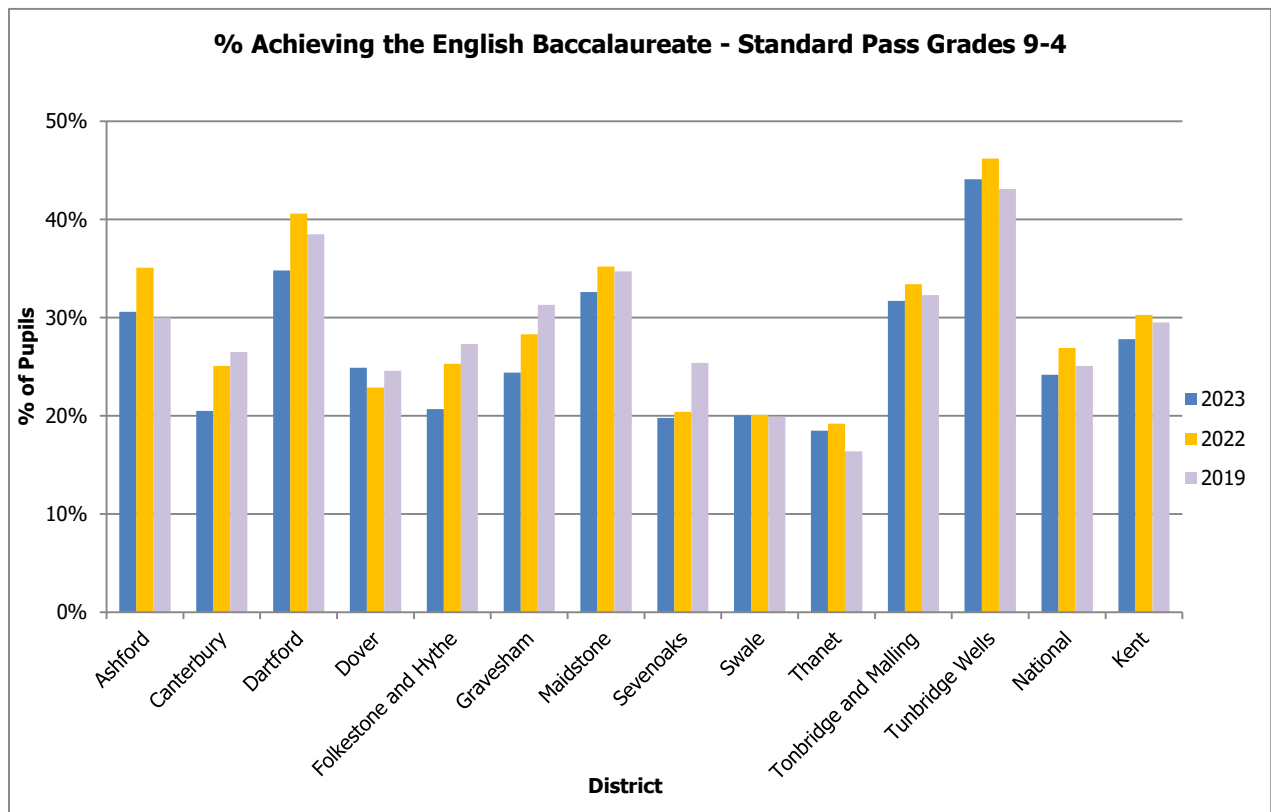
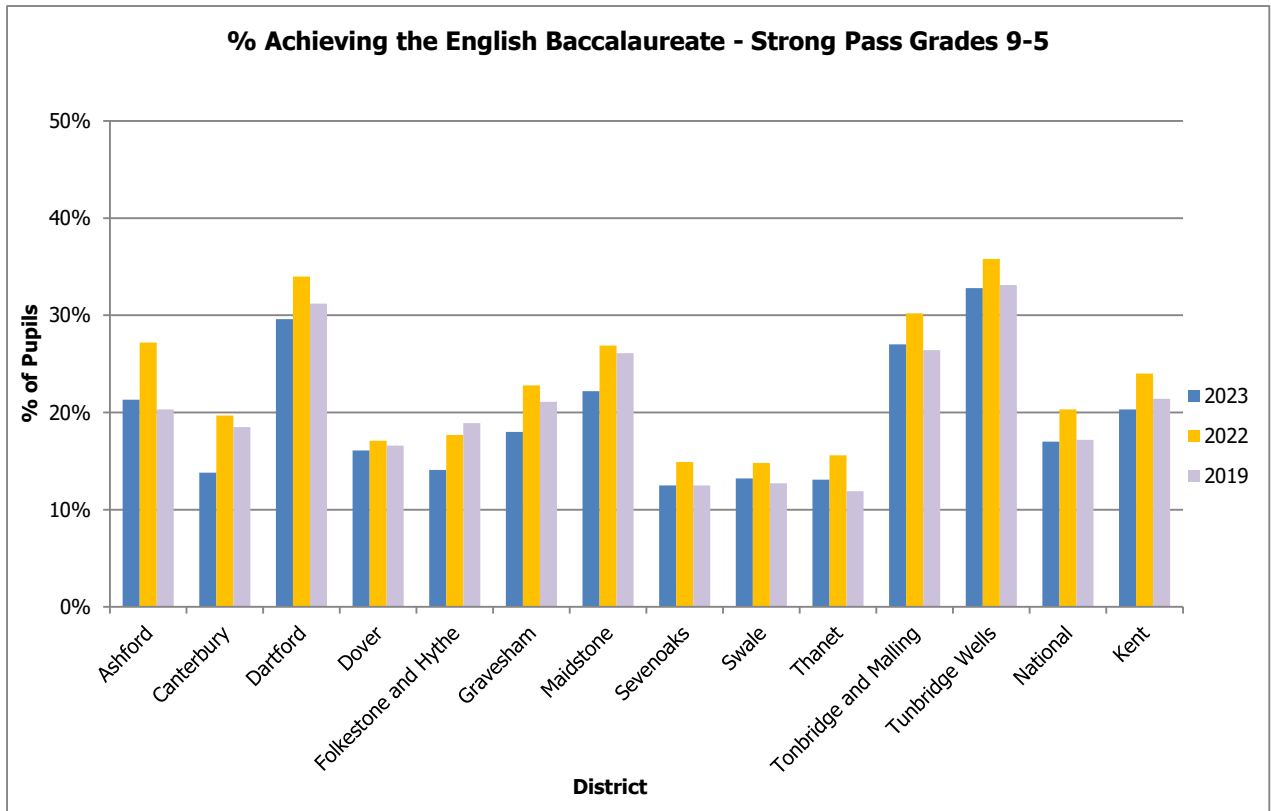
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Key Stage Four Trend by District - 2019 to 2023

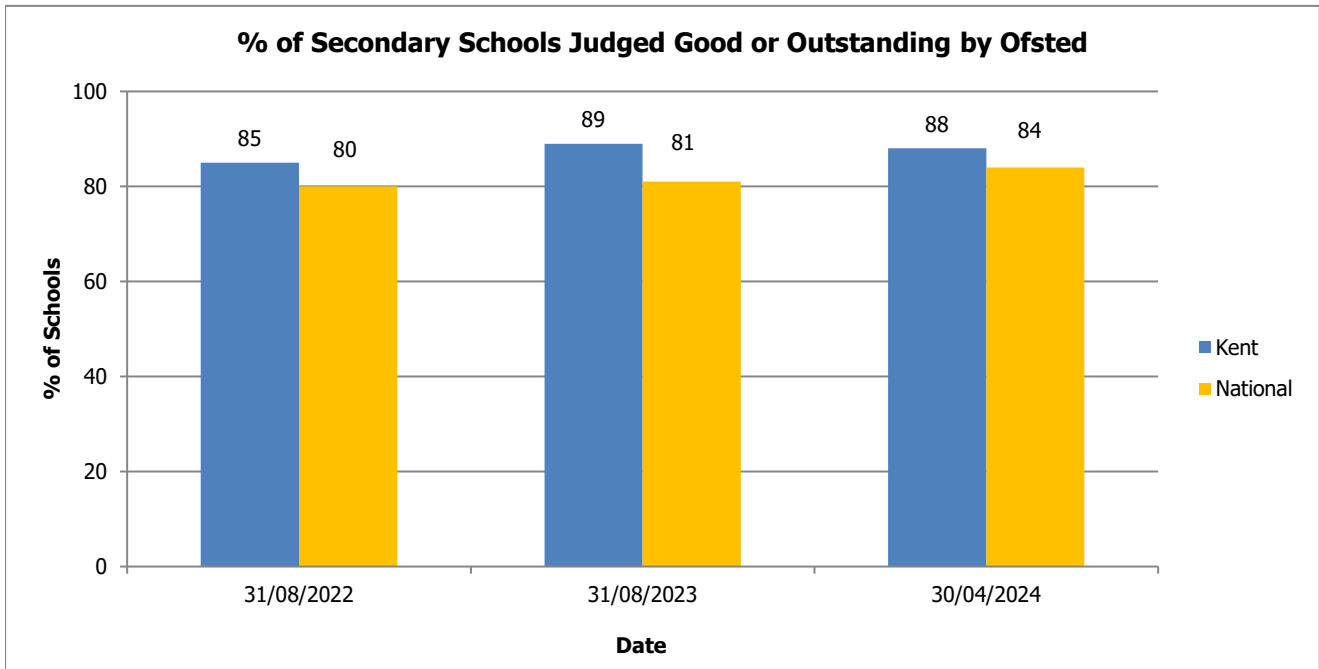
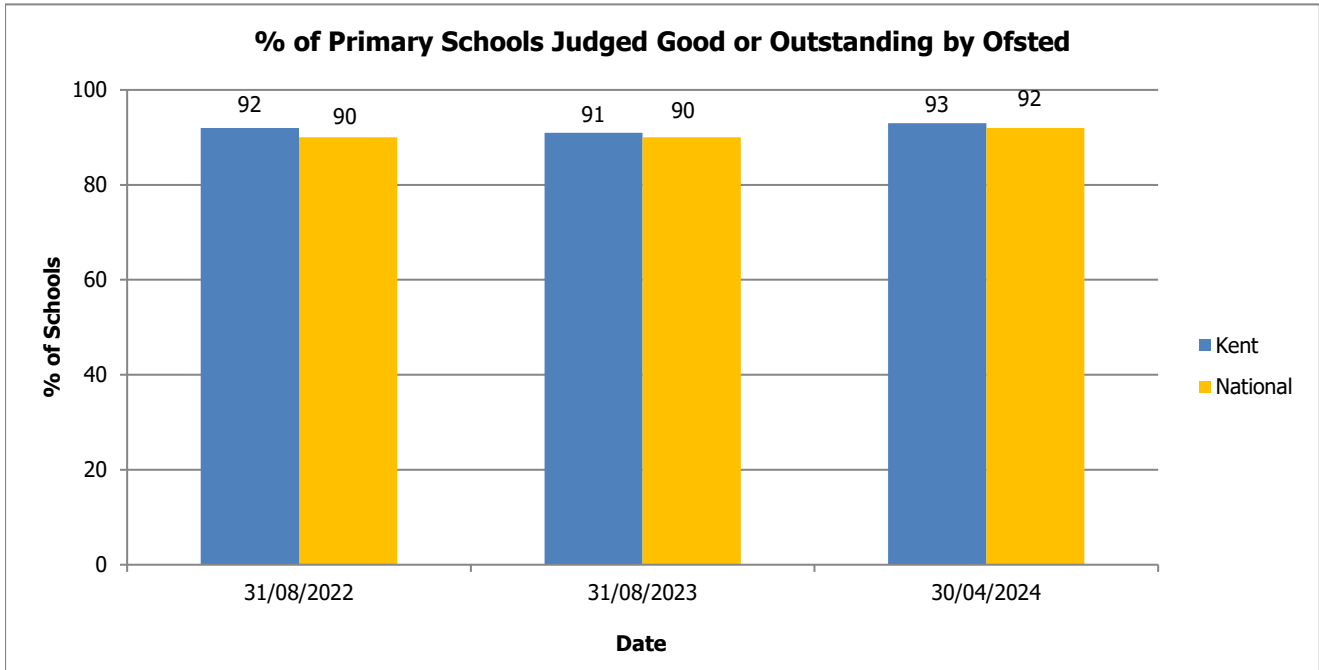

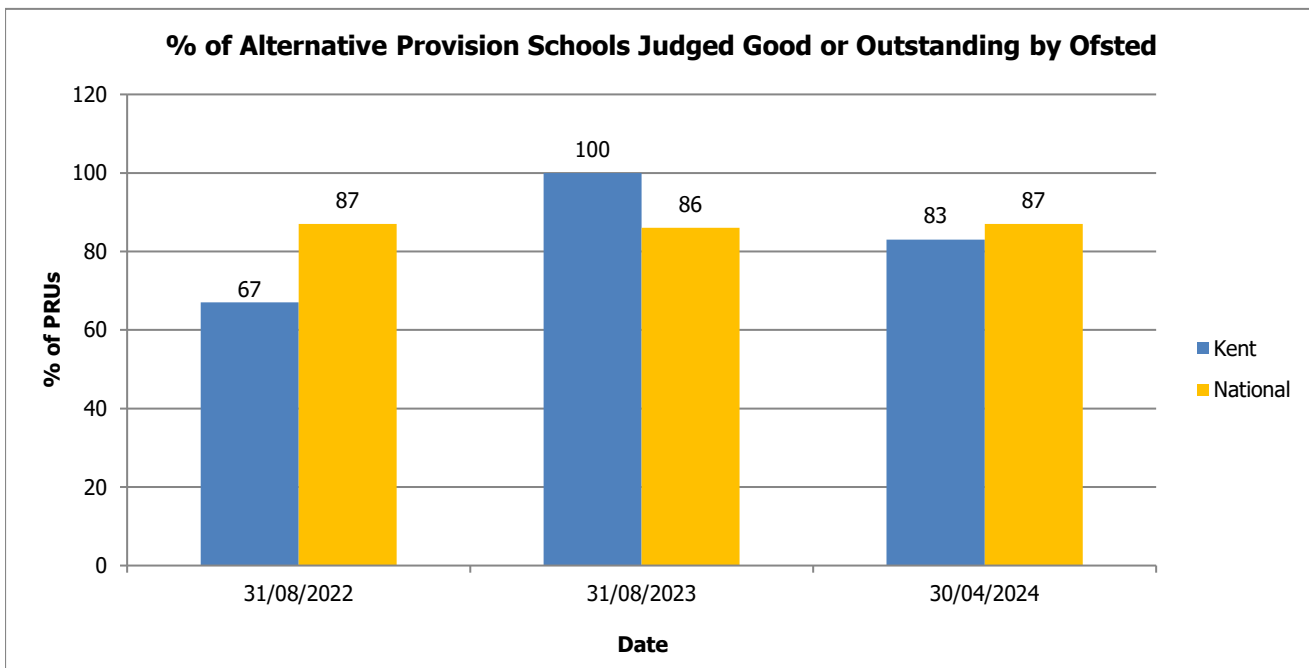
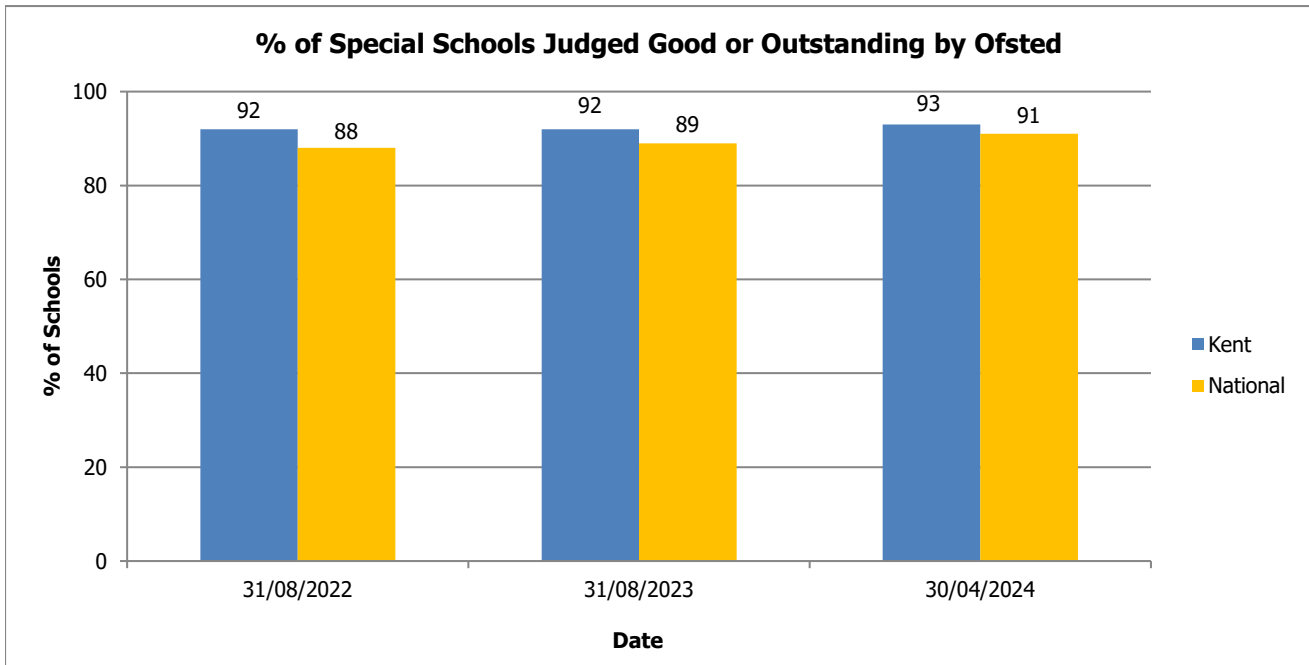
